Travel writing and ethnographic knowledge

The lecture will give students insight into the role ethnographic knowledge (descriptions of peoples, their customs, political organization, language, in a word, of human diversity) played in different forms of travel narratives in the period after the 16th century, when it became almost an essential part of the genre, and into some of the reasons for this ascent. Also, it will look into the role travelers played in forming early anthropological discourse and beyond, as well as into points of continuity between travel writing and ethnographic text.



Ethnographic fieldwork in post-conflict regions

The lecture will present ethnographic research in several post-conflict localities in Croatia, with an overview of the historical, social and political context of the regions in question. It will also try to address, in discussion with the students, ethical, theoretical and epistemological considerations entailed in conducting research in post-conflict regions and dealing with topics such as political violence, forced displacement, traumatic experience, etc.

Ivona Grgurinović was born in 1979 in Zagreb. In 2004 she completed her studies in ethnology and English language and literature at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences. She received her PhD in 2012. The title of her dissertation is Travel Writing and Ethnography – Contemporary Foreign Travel Writing on Croatia. Since 2007 she has been employed at the Department of Ethnology and Cultural Anthropology at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, where she teaches courses on the relationships between anthropology and travel, and on anthropology of violence and conflict. Her scientific interests encompass the history and theory of sociocultural anthropology and ethnology; the history of field research; cultures of travel and travel writing; violence and conflict.
